- ✧ The two year Melton program consists of 30 classes each year, held weekly for two hours.
- ✧ Knowledge of Hebrew is not required.
- ✧ There are no exams, grades or prerequisites.
- ✧ The Melton Israel Seminar, available only to Melton students, is a unique combination of travel and learning in Israel.
- ✧ Classes are accessible online.
- ✧ Extra-curricular activities may include: holiday celebrations, guest lecturers and field trips.
- ✧ Upon completion of the two years of study, students receive a Certificate of Jewish Study from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem.

TUITION PER YEAR (SEPT.-MAY)

The full tuition for one-year, which includes 60 hours of classes, a Student Curriculum containing thousands of dollars worth of texts, and other "extras," is \$825. THE MELTON CURRICULUM

FIRST YEAR COURSES:

The Rhythms of Jewish Living

The analysis of ideas, beliefs and practices that shape a Jewish life, as well as an exploration of observances that are connected to the daily, weekly, monthly and yearly cycles, along with life cycle events. The "why" as well as the "what" of Jewish traditional life patterns.

The Purposes of Jewish Living

The study of the ultimate purposes of Judaism and the development of the covenant with God. Discussion of essential Jewish theological concepts and ideas, as they unfold in the Bible, Talmud, and other sacred texts.

SECOND YEAR COURSES:

The Dramas of Jewish Living

Key events are identified and discussed for their meaning in the context of Jewish history, and for the insight they provide into today's world. The study of historical texts, from the Biblical period to the present, explores and informs our understanding of the dramatic events, developments and issues that have confronted the Jewish People.

The Ethics of Jewish Living

A text-centered approach to the study of the ethical issues which emerge in our relationships, such as family, justice, death, sexuality, and community, with case studies from Biblical, Talmudic, rabbinic and contemporary literature.
